When Persistence in Prayer Pays Off

The principle of persistence in prayer is a key theme in the Bible, which teaches us the importance of not giving up, faith, and trusting in God's timing. Several passages highlight why we should pray persistently and how God responds to such faith, but personally, the story of a widowed woman has impacted me the most over the years.

In Luke 18, Jesus shares a parable, which often goes unnoticed by many. Still, it is impressive how Luke collects from the beginning Jesus' intention to share it with his disciples to teach them to "always pray, and not to faint."

To better understand this parable, we must remember that widows were the most helpless people in biblical times. Usually, they had no education, and when their husbands died, they were left to their fate, without sustenance for themselves or their children.

However, this widow persisted in obtaining justice, making her complaint and claim to the evil judge of her city. This man had no fear of God or appreciation for human dignity but gave this widow the verdict she sought because of her persistence.

The poor but determined widow in this parable teaches us three indispensable lessons for our prayer life:

1) Prayer is a necessity.

Jesus never taught His disciples that prayer was an option or a "good suggestion" but that it was necessary for our walk with Him. Jesus Himself modeled complete dependence on prayer (Matthew 14:23), and He did not take any steps in His ministry without first consulting with His Father. He even prayed while hanging on the cross! (Luke 23:24, 46).

By making prayer our need, we establish that God is the source of our strength, and everything we do will primarily glorify Him and make His light shine in this world (Matthew 5:16).

2) Prayer is an attitude.

Jesus goes further in teaching His parable and challenges us to depend on prayer and live it. Just as the widow maintained a persistent attitude before the judge to obtain justice (Luke 18:3), prayer must become an intentional attitude in our lives.

One amazing thing to me is that the widow's persistence caused the judge's decisions to change in her favor (Luke 18:5). This speaks to the fact that a believer's attitude of prayer does not go unnoticed but impacts all the environments in which we move and brings honor to the name of the Lord.

3) Prayer is a privilege.

By studying other religions, I discovered a pattern in which many of them seek to show the gods as distant from human beings, who only need the slightest excuse to unleash their fury and send curses to the earth.

But unlike other religions, God is close to humans. Do you know why this is true? He has left us a powerful tool, prayer, so we can connect with Him and see His will at work. Unlike the evil judge in our parable, justice, goodness, and love emanate from God's heart. That is why Jesus said without hesitation to his disciples: "And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them?" (Luke 18:7).

These three lessons should always encourage us to persist in prayer. Persistence will bear fruit in God's perfect timing, which is often different from our own. God's perfect timing is when our prayers align with His perfect will, and He brings the best outcome for us.

Our parable ends with a passage that may seem daunting, but it is also a challenge to all who trust in God and put all things in prayer to Him: "Nevertheless when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Luke 18:8).

If the entire church of Jesus persisted in prayer today, we would see miraculous spiritual transformations in a decaying world. This includes putting all our concerns, worries, and desires in prayer to Him, surrendering to His will and trusting in His plan.

Do you already have a persistent prayer life, or will you start having one?
